



Dean's Staff Awards Presented to Kevin McGuigan and Paola Della Porta

Dr. Kevin McGuigan in Physiology and Medical Physics and Dr. Paola Della Porta in the Research Office were named as this year's winners of the Dean's Award.

They were each presented with a commemorative plaque and a cash prize of €1000 by Professor Cathal Kelly, Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences at the annual Medical Faculty Dinner, which took place on Friday, 2nd October.

Introduced in 2008, the Dean's Award is a scheme that recognises the diverse contributions and achievements made by RCSI staff. The awards honour members of the College who have shown an outstanding commitment to developing and supporting the work of the College.

Professor Cathal Kelly, Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences said "One of the great pleasures of these awards is that we get to recognise excellent RCSI people, who exemplify our noble purpose – Endeavour, Innovation, Collaboration and Service. Both Kevin and Paola are talented and remarkably able people, and I am delighted to have the opportunity to present them with these awards."

He continued "Paola is a remarkably hard working lady and talented individual and the best linguist in the place, while Kevin is something of a renaissance man – a great teacher, supportive colleague, runs one of our best outreach programmes, and has brought science to the developing world."

RCSI-Bahrain Celebrates its 5th Anniversary

This month, RCSI Bahrain is celebrating its 5th anniversary. The past five years have represented a huge success for the university since its official opening on 13th October 2004.

With an initial intake of 28 medical students representing seven different countries in October 2004, RCSI Bahrain now has more than 700 undergraduate students from 35 countries worldwide. It has 75 full time staff and a mixture of both Irish and Arabic professionals. In February 2009, a new purpose built university, was officially opened by

The state of the art campus, with a capacity for 2,000 students, caters for the growing number of students from Bahrain, the Gulf region and beyond, providing undergraduate courses in Medicine, Nursing and Midwifery and Postgraduate studies in Nursing, Healthcare Ethics and Law.

Founding President Professor Kevin O'Malley said "Those of us who have worked on the Bahrain project are privileged to have contributed to a bold exercise in healthcare education. It has been a challenging endeavour mainly because of the demanding time frame we set ourselves. We will graduate doctors, nurses and masters degree holders in June 2010, a mere six years after our foundation in 2004. The unanimity of purpose exhibited by our staff, coupled with the wonderful support of our RCSI Dublin colleagues, have proved to be a powerful combination in achieving our success to date."

Dr. Kevin McGuigan - Academic Award Winner

Kevin, a senior lecturer in the Department of Physiology and Medical Physics, has worked with RCSI for just over 18 years. During this time he has devoted himself to excellence in teaching and research. Kevin's research into the area of solar disinfection of drinking water has had a direct impact on 2.5 million people in over 35 developing countries.

Kevin is also the Director of the RCSI Mini-Med School programme which he has helped run in the College for the past seven years. He received funding through the RCSI Stepping Stones Initiative to establish a Mini-Med School Road Show in cities outside Dublin (the first of which took place in Waterford in September 2008).

From the very beginning of his career with RCSI, Kevin has developed a tireless interest in biomedical-related physics and is active in the teaching of biophysics to undergraduate students in medicine, physiotherapy and pharmacy. He also plays a key role in the postgraduate training and development of the College's post-doctoral fellows, PhD and MSc students.

Kevin said "I was taken completely by surprise when Cathal Kelly announced my name at the Faculty Dinner. I was so dumbstruck that I almost had a Sally Field/Gwyneth Paltrow moment when I accepted the award. Of course it was only once I had sat down that I realised that I should have thanked my wife and daughter for their support and patience during the many times my research has taken me abroad; my colleagues who nominated me and the other SODISWATER, MiniMed School and Foundation Year team members who did most of the work and deserve most of the credit.

Dr. Paola Della Porta - Support Award Winner

Paola, Associate Director of Research at the RCSI Research Institute started working with the College in 2002. She has played an integral part in international scientific collaborations with the University of Naples. This collaboration has resulted in a successful post-doctoral mobility programme between RCSI and Naples, and a Drug Discovery Programme between RCSI, DCU, Montpellier, Naples and Moscow. In addition, Paola has played a key role in developing the HEA PRTLI Cycle 5 proposal for the establishment of the RCSI Translational Research Centre, as part of the Translational Research Hub, in collaboration with DCU and NUIM.



Dr Rics' Recipes

SELECTION OF MINI BRUSCHETTAS

Serves 4

INGREDIENTS

- 1 large baguette or sour dough
- loaf, cut into 12 bite size slices
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- Rocket & mixed leaves

For the Brie Bruschetta:

- 40 g brie, sliced into 4
- 4 tsp basil pesto
- 1 tomato, sliced

For the Smoked Mackerel Bruschetta

- 1 fillet smoked mackerel (100 g)
- 30 half-fat crème fraiche
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 2 chives, finely chopped

For the Tomato and Mozzarella Bruschetta

- 40g fresh buffalo mozzarella, sliced into 4
- 1 tomato, sliced
- 3 leaves of fresh basil, shredded



Method

- Put the slices of bread on a baking tray. Mix the olive oil and crushed garlic together and drizzle on the bread. Bake in an oven at 175 degrees centigrade for 5-8 minutes until golden brown. Remove and let them cool.
- For the smoke mackerel bruschetta: mix the crème fraiche, lemon juice and chives together. Cut the mackerel fillet into 4 pieces and place each piece on a slice of the toasted bread. Top with the crème fraiche mix.
- For the Brie Bruschetta: spread the pesto evenly between 4 slices of the toasted bread. Place a slice of tomato and then a slice of brie and put under the grill until the brie begins to melt.
- For the tomato and mozzarella bruschetta: put a slice of tomato on each piece of bread. Top with a slice of mozzarella and put under the grill until the mozzarella begins to melt. Take out and top with a little shredded basil.
- **To plate** Put one of each of bruschetta and serve with rocket and mixed leave salad.
