Purpose

To enhance RCSI's international competiveness, reputation and recognition as a researchintensive university, through strategic planning, growth and development of RCSI research activities.

Specific Functions

- To identify and catalyze strategic opportunities to grow RCSI research and innovation activities and enhance RCSI research performance and impact.
- To inform research policy and development in areas of strategic importance to RCSI including named research clusters as defined in the RCSI strategy.
- To improve research performance and metrics as measured by RCSI's position in global university rankings, strategic KPIs and benchmarking
- To develop recommendations for growth of RCSI research programs and reputation including potential seed-fund activities aimed at generating increased external funding.
- For cluster leads: to represent & promote, develop a strategic plan for growing activity in their individual research clusters and foster engagement and collaboration with other internal clusters and external partners
- To advise on the relevance and efficacy of RCSI research and innovation policy and procedures and to review proposed changes to such procedures
- To inform effective communication of RCSI research to internal, national and international stakeholders.
- To grow doctoral student numbers and promote excellence in career development and training for researchers
- To advise on strategic development of RCSI research facilities and infrastructure
- To advise the Director of Research & Innovation and the RCSI Research Executive Management Team (ERMT) on research matters.
