School of Pharmacy

Steve Kerrigan from the School of Pharmacy, along with colleagues from the University of Bristol, has discovered that oral bacteria that escape into the bloodstream can cause blood clots and trigger life-threatening growths on heart valves. The research was recently presented at the Society for General Microbiology's Spring Conference. Further research arising from this study could lead to new drugs to tackle infective heart disease.

Congratulations to **Alice Holton** of Senior Cycle Pharmacy who won the Pharmacy Law and Ethics Association (PLEA) prize for her essay in bio-ethics. The PLEA competition, from which entrants are invited from all Schools of Pharmacy in the UK, was extended to the Irish Schools of Pharmacy this year and RCSI is delighted to have one of its students ranked first across the UK and Ireland which is strong quality metric for the RCSI undergraduate B.Sc. (Pharm.) programme.

Well done to **James Barlow**, **Helena Kelly**, **Judith Strawbridge** and **Michelle Flood** in organising the first RCSI-Scavenger Hunt amongst academic staff and students from the undergraduate and M. Pharm. programmes. The alcohol-free event was to raise awareness and funds for the Pharmacy Benevolent Fund which assists pharmacists and their families who experience financial hardship. Academic staff and over 130 students participated across the city in a meticulously organised event which raised 1000 euro for the Benevolent Fund.

Department of Geriatric Medicine

Cora McGreevy and **David Williams** from the Department of Geriatric Medicine have recently had a paper published in the Annals of Internal Medicine. Their research has revealed new insights into the evidence linking Vitamin D deficiency and cardiovascular disease. Their research concluded that further large-scale studies are needed to prove that vitamin D supplementation has a role in protecting people from cardiovascular disease. Until further research is complete, vitamin D cannot be recommended as a treatment for preventing heart disease
