DEPARMENT OF PSYCHIATRY

Congratulations to **Ian Kelleher**, PhD student of Professor Mary Cannon, who has had a paper entitled "Suicidal Behaviour in Adolescents with Psychotic Symptoms" accepted for publication in the top-ranking journal Archives of General Psychiatry. Ian has now had four papers accepted for publication in four consecutive months. A new record for the Department of Psychiatry!

MOLECULAR MEDICINE

Congratulations to **Aine Nolan** (HRB PhD scholar) on winning the Sheppard Prize for Best Poster at the Annual Beaumont Hospital Scientific Meeting Aine's presentation on the 'role of novel oestrogen-sensitive microRNAs in colon carcinoma tumour promotion' is a collaborative study between Molecular Medicine and Cancer Genetics.

Stephen Keely received a Science Foundation Ireland's Technology Innovation Development Award announced by the Minister for Research and Innovation, Seán Sherlock TD and Director General of SFI, Prof Mark Ferguson. The TIDA award provides financial support to research teams to enable them to progress their research from concept to market.

A research paper "Sexual dimorphism and oestrogen regulation of KCNE3 expression modulates the functional properties of KCNQ1 K+ channels" published by **Prof Brian Harvey** was the most viewed paper from the November 2011 issue of The Journal of Physiology during the first three months of its publication. Brian also presented this work at the International Meeting on Optimization of Mouse Models in Human Disease, held this month in Chile
