Great Pink Run Team

Well done to Aisling Hurley and Samantha McGregor for their organisation of the Great Pink Run in aid of Breast Cancer Ireland. Over €110,000 was raised for Breast Cancer Ireland in support of pioneering breast cancer research programmes, and the provision of more personalised treatment plans for patients diagnosed. The sun shone on over 3,000 participants and their families. The Point Village venue was a sea of Pink with balloon modellers, stilt walkers and face painters galore amidst the amusements, refreshments and the sound of 98FM's Big Red!

NEW LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRE

A new Learning Resource Centre was recently opened in RCSI Bahrain. The new facility has forty per cent more study space than the previous area and it adds a total of 1,500 additional square meters to the campus.

New additions to the LRC include a lounge for staff and healthcare professionals, a room for postgraduate students and a teaching lab for Information literacy and other module integrated teaching, and IT Express with 10 new laptops connected to the internet. This sanctum for learning is now referred to as "the Oasis of Knowledge".
