#### Introduction

There are many challenges faced by interns as they transition from medical student role to the post of Intern. Whilst most undergraduate schools provide a brief preparatory "intern shadowing" period, the leap from student to pre-registered doctor is still a very big one. This symposium is about how we as medical educators might better prepare our students for the transition from student to doctor. It is also about examining how well prepared our students are for the work environments that they enter as Interns. Once graduates enter the workplace, how are they trained, developed and supported?

The goals of this symposium are:

- To provide an overview of how graduates are prepared for practice as interns in Ireland
- To describe the different approaches to internship training in Ireland and the challenges faced by interns
- To provide a forum for the exchange of views and ideas about preparing graduates for practice and intern training in Ireland
- To provide ideas and themes that will inform/revise a national curriculum of training needs of both graduating medical students and of interns
